

Get College Credit Now!

If you are a high school student interested in earning college credit while you go to high school, there are several ways that you can do that. Yes, you can earn college credit while you earn high school credit! Check out the ways that you can make it happen.

Advanced Standing or Transcribed Credit

Your high school may have courses that articulate for college credit. If you meet certain requirements, you might be eligible for advanced standing credit or transcribed credit. Every high school has different agreements in place and they change from year to year. Check out the Articulation Grid to see what courses your high school offers for articulation at Blackhawk Technical College.

Youth Options

If you are a high school junior or senior, you are eligible for Youth Options courses. This is a good way to get ahead and earn credit for college. You will earn credits for your high school diploma while getting a jump start on college. You need to apply to your local school board by March 1 for the fall semester and by October 1 for the spring semester. Youth Apprenticeship

Participate in a Youth Apprenticeship program and you can some college credit. For example, students who complete a 2-year automotive apprenticeship or a 2-year welding apprenticeship earn advanced standing credit when they enroll in a technical college program within 27 months of graduation. It's a great way to earn your high school diploma and earn some college credit. Talk to your high school counselor about youth apprenticeships available at your school.
